



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 12<sup>th</sup> of September Anno Dom 1737. The above described tract of land was Surveyed unto Thomas Prees Beginning at a White Oak thence east north east by Vacant land 157 Perches to a White Oak thence east south east by the Settlement of John McAntyre 240 Perches to a White Oak thence South 27 degrees West by Moses Edmondson 44 Perches to a Post thence West South West by—Sinkey 228 Perches to a White Oak thence North 47 degrees West by the Improvement of William Morrison 148 Perches to a Post thence North 43 degrees East 23 Perches to a Post Thence North 47 degrees West 60 Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing two hundred and Sixty ~~two~~<sup>five</sup> Acres beside ye allowance of six P Cent for Roads.
