



The above draught represents a tract of land situate on the Branches of Little-Beaver Creek in Strasburg township Lancaster County. The one part marked *A*, was surveyd originally by John Taylor in Pursuance of a Warrant granted to William Philips dated the fourteenth day of February <sup>1733</sup>. The other by John Churchman in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Emmanuel Heer (who acted in Trust for George & Thomas Churchman Millwrights) dated 12<sup>th</sup> of November A. D. 1736, the said Emmanuel Heer on their Behalf having Purchased the said Philips's Right to the former Survey & Improvements. The Whole on a Resurvey thereof lately made for Thomas Churchman appears to Contain 320 acres & the allowance of 6<sup>a</sup> P Cent for Roads &c That is, in the former Survey to Philips 160<sup>a</sup> & in the later 160<sup>a</sup> & allowance as aforesaid: Resurveyd the 26<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>rd</sup> month 1759.
