



Pursuant to the order of the Honorable the Board of Property Dated 16<sup>th</sup> March 1798\* (to) above resurvey was made on the land of James Boreland in Antrim Township Franklin County by which it appears that said Land is interfered with at A by a Survey made on Warrant to John Irwin Dated 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1755 & said to have been patented in October 1765 This mistake was probably first occasioned by a 20 Perches lost in first measuring the line S 25° W 78 P making it necessary inclosing the field work to add to the length of the two most northerly lines which would give the whole Tract the appearance it has on the original Return & probably bro't the said interfering Survey on it as above. The marked Trees on the outside lines of the Triangle at A being Blocked & Counted are found to agree with the date of this Original Survey and all the other lines of the same seem established by common consent of all parties to be as above represented, The whole was resurveyed & the lines block & examined on the 23<sup>rd</sup> May 1798 in presence of the parties & neighbours adjoining.
