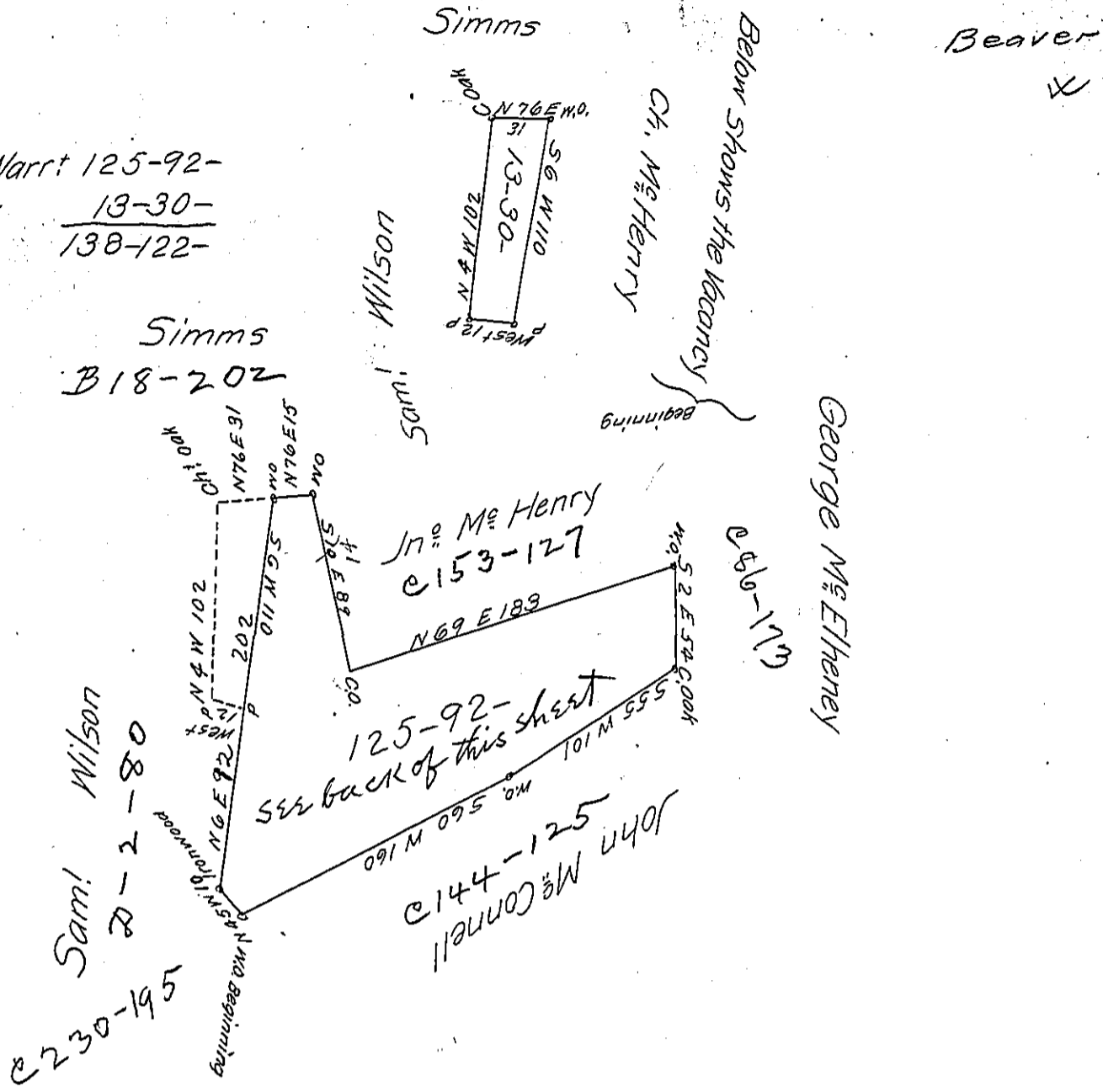

The above Draft Included in the Black lines was Returned in July 29th 1815 on a warrant Granted Charles McHenry dated 7th Dec^r 1813 Surveyed (or by) 20th 1815 the Warrant called for ^{Land} adjoining Sam! Wilson & in consequence of not having Wilson's Patent we ran the course from the Ironwood N. 6 E. 202 perches, whereas Wilson patent only ran 92 p^{er} on that line then went 12 perches ^{west} as represented in the above Diagram by the Dotted lines leaving a Vacancy of 13 Acres & 30 perches between Wilson & McHenry, he prays the Board of property, he paying for the Land, that a patent would be granted Including the Vacancy in the first return which make 138 Acres 122^{&c}.
