

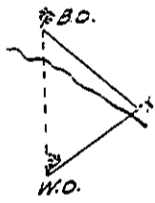
Edward Armstrong

Draught of a tract of land Situate on the head Waters of Lost Creek, Fermanagh Township, formerly Cumberland, now Mifflin County, appears Survey<sup>d</sup> by William Maclay, Late Deputy surveyor the 9<sup>th</sup> of April 1767. Said to Contain 118 acres and 64 perches and the Allowance &c. In pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Samuel Mitchell dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1766. Resurvey<sup>d</sup> the 25<sup>th</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup> of June 1805, and appears to Contain One hundred and Eighteen Acres and 67 perches and the Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent for roads &c. In pursuance of the aforesaid Warrant Directed to me for Execution.

Notes.

The line bearing S. 54  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 52 p<sup>s</sup> from a post Cor. of Edward Armstrong to a B.O. Cor. of Hugh McElroy appears not to have been ever Mark<sup>d</sup> untill this day.

The Angle to the Eastward of the dotted line thro the above Draught from a W.O. on line of Edward Armstrong to the B.O. Cor. of Hugh McElroy is Claim<sup>d</sup> by John Meyers by virtue of a Survey made for him the 23<sup>d</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup>. 1804, in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November 1804.



This line appears to have been Mark<sup>d</sup> about 38 or 39 years ago. &c. Said to have been formerly made for Saml Mitchell.
