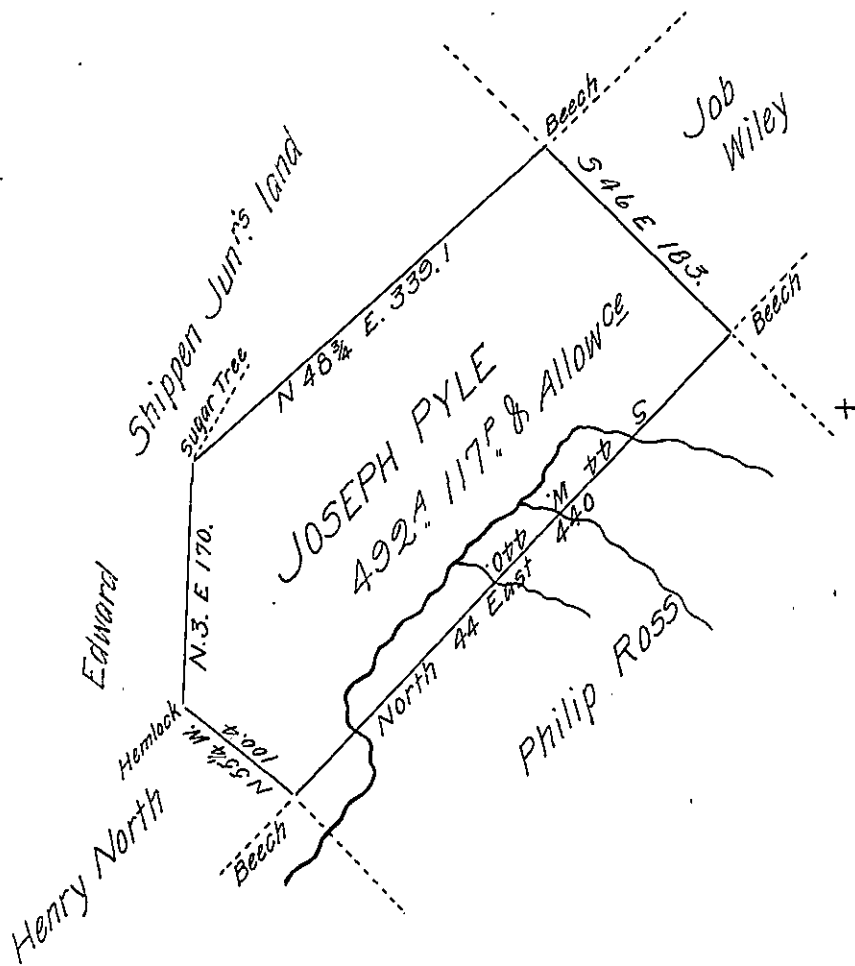


Scale 160<sup>fs</sup> to the Inch
