Corner for Samuel Jackson, Thence by land of Jacob Gross' heirs in the warrantee name of Magdalena Miller and Henry Gross, N. 77° E. 48 ps. to a chest oak stump. Thence by another tract of said Gross' heirs in the warrantee name of Philip Berger, S. 4° E. 11 ps. to a post, N. 39 1/2° E. 10.6 ps. to a post. Thence by another tract of same heirs, (warrantee name unknown) S. 3 1/2° E. 21.7 ps. to a pine stump, S. 78° W. 50.5 ps. to a W.O. Corner. Thence by a tract in the Warrantee name of Samuel Jackson N. 21° W. 15.5 ps. to the Beginning.
