Situate on the Waters of Reuben's Run a branch of Redstone Creek in Manallin Township Fayette County & Resurveyed the 4th. day of December 1814. In pursuance of a Warrant dated the first day of September 1786.

Note, the whole Survey embracing the dotted lines had been Surveyed in the year 1786 - But error therein was discovered an interference which prevented its being then Returned - In this plan is represented by the Black, and dotted lines all the land (ob. l.) was then Surveyed under the Warrant of Isaac Pierce - which by the original Survey amounted to 167 1/4 a. and allowan (ob. l.) when the Errors were Corrected) And as you will perceive, by the evidences that must be produced, it descended to Christian Wireman. "Who failing" the same among others was Seized taken in Execution and Sold for the payment of Wireman's debt (ob. l.) Joseph Pryor purchased the whole of the above - And by Indenture dated the 2d. day of May 1801 Conveyed that part represent (ob. l. d.) Black lines to James Loughhead, - the dotted lines represent the residuary part of the whole, as sold by the Sheriff to Joseph Pryor - Who by Indenture dated 31st. January 1801 Conveyed the same to David Stephens - the two first mentioned will be produced, "the latter" if ind. on Record &c.
