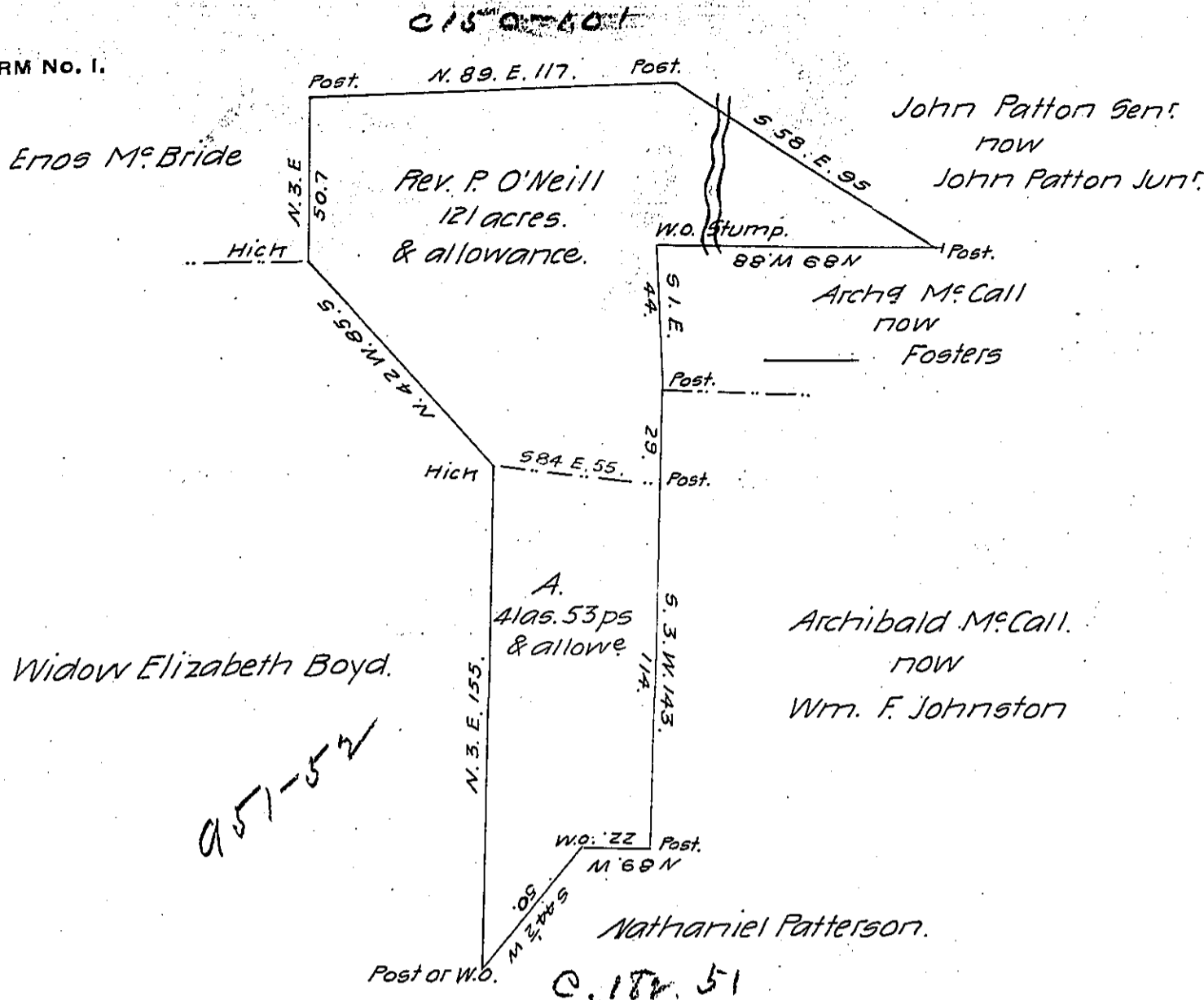


FORM No. 1.

James Burford Genl. of Armstrong County enters a Caveat to the granting a patent to the Warrantee Rev. P. O'Neill or any person claiming under him for that part of the above described tract of land which is represented by the dotted line and includes the letter A. Containing forty one acres and fifty three perches and allowance of Six per cent &c. Said James Burford claims said part of the tract of land by virtue of a Warrant dated March 18th A.D. 1862 for forty five acres of land with interest commencing September 1st A.D. 1858.
