



Situate in Shrewsbury Township York County. Containing within the black lines as above set forth five acres one hundred and thirty perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 126 $\frac{3}{4}$  acres & allowance. Originally surveyed by William Kersey late D.S. on the 25<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1789 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Jacob Groud for— as dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June A. D. 1789. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract by William Kersey aforesaid, on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> month A. D. 1793. and now at the request of Daniel Groud the present owner of said part the Draught is examined, corrected, calculated, and returned for Confirmation March 18<sup>th</sup> 1822.
