



Situate in Newbury township in the County of York containing as above set forth thirty acres sixty one perches and the usual allowance of six P^{ts} Cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 214^{ac} 125 P^{ts} and allowance of land originally surveyed by Charles Lukens late D.S. on the — day of — A.D. — in pursuance of the application of Adam Hoff No 4687 for 200^{ac} dated the 8th day of January A.D. 1768. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 21st day of July 1818 — and now at the request of John Hoff the present owner of the said part returned for confirmation — 9th January 1822.
