



By virtue of a warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries Dated July 21<sup>st</sup> 1738  
 I have Survey and Laid out unto John Rankin, in the Township of Pennsborough in  
 the County of Lancaster on the West side obliterated Two Hundred and six  
 acres of Land with allowance of six P. Cent Beginning at a black Oak  
 in the line of Andrew Millers land thence North sixty two Degrees  
 East one hundred and forty perches to a Black Oak thence South  
 Eighty two Degrees Westerly Two hundred and three perches to a black Oak  
 thence by land of James Brown South Eight Degrees East one hundred and twenty  
 three perches to a Wallnut by Yellow Breeches Creek and then Down the same  
 Traversing the severall Courses thereof near about one mile to the place  
 of Beginning, Surveyd May - 1743 by me Zach. Butcher, Dp. S.  
 Vacated by, and Patented on a warrant granted to Matthew Futtledge dated  
 31<sup>st</sup> August 1747

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in  
 the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made  
 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of  
 February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused  
 the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg,
