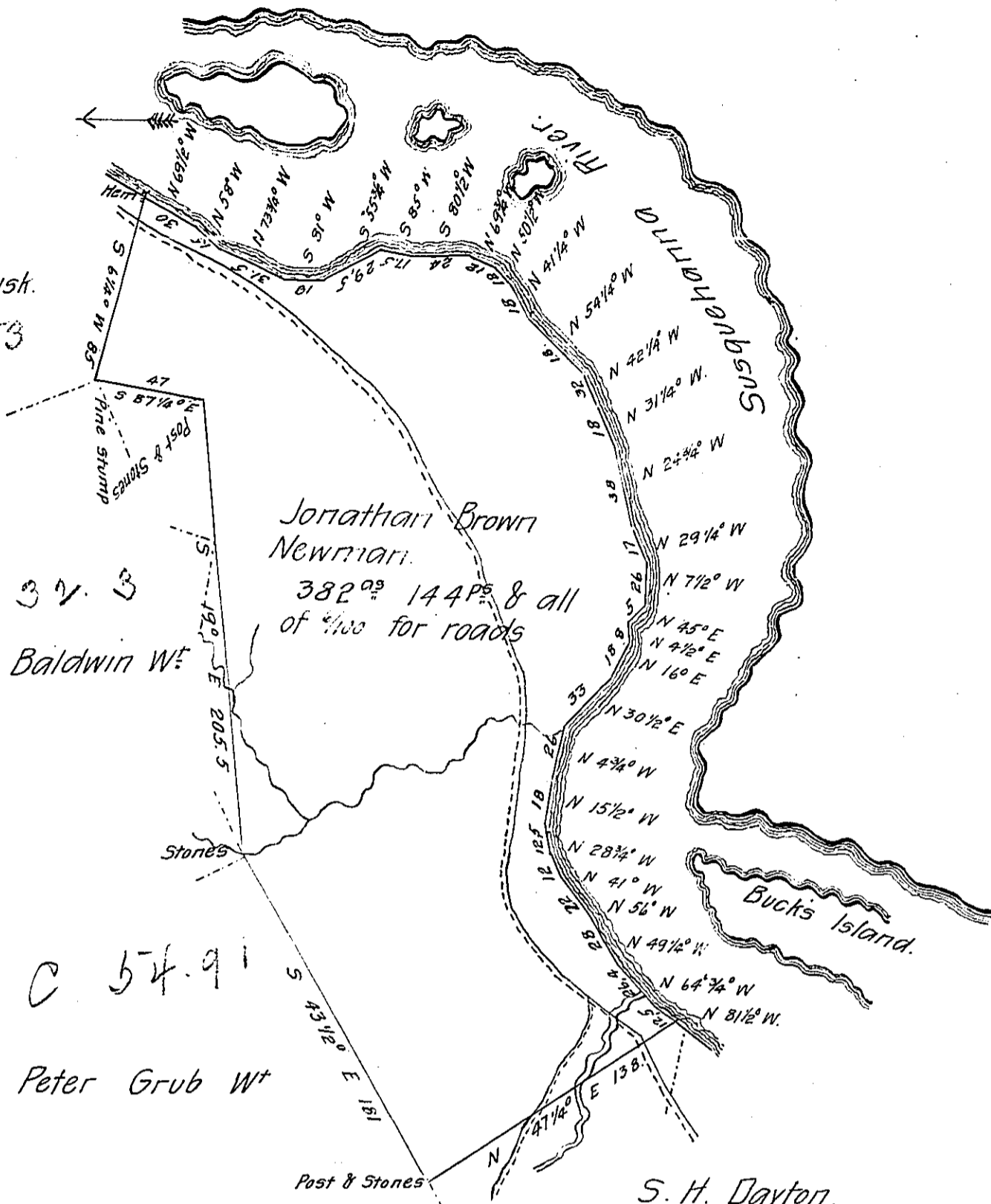

Lusk, and the Susquehanna River, Surveyed on the twenty ninth day of March A. D. 1859. by Timothy Boyle, for Samuel H Dayton, which Survey is approved and adopted by me, in pursuance of Jonathan B. Newman's improvement warrant, bearing date the sixteenth day of May A. D. 1815. Containing three hundred and eighty two acres and one hundred and forty four perches, and the allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Containing about two hundred acres of an improvement, commenced about the 1st day of March A. D. 1809. Joel Turrell, Surveyor of Susq. Co. To John Rowe Esq, Surveyor General.

N.B. The above mentioned Tract is occupied by actual Settlers, Tenants, of the said Samuel H. Dayton, who claims said land by virtue of legal conveyances from the heirs of said Jonathan B. Newman and their assigns. June 6th 1859.
