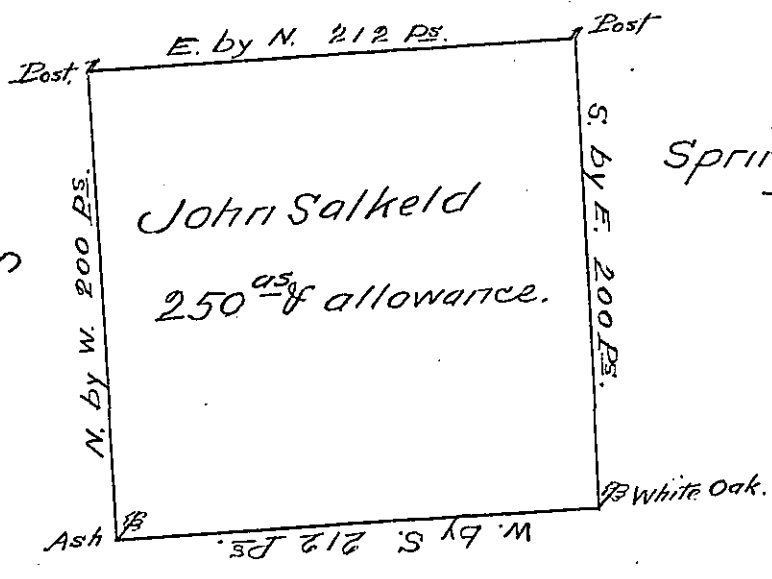

In Pursuance of <sup>an Order</sup> ~~a Warrant~~ from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the first day of December 1728, Surveyed unto John Salkeld on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January 1729 A Tract of Land in Caln in the County of Chester (being the original purchase of Lancelot Followfield, of Great Strickland in the County of Westmoreland) Beginning at a White Oak being a Corner of Robert Green's Land thence West by South by the same 212 perches to an Ash, thence North by West by John Taylor's Land 200 pches to a Post, thence East by North 212 pches to a post thence South by East by Spring Town Manor 200 Pches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred & Fifty acres and the allowance of Six & Cent

Returned into ye Secretarys Office by Vertue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Proprietaries dated the 1<sup>st</sup>. day of Feb. 1734.
