



In Pursuance of two Warrants. The one bearing Date the 14th Day of June Anno Dom. 1734. And the other the 25th Day of August Anno Dom 1735 For fifty Acres each I have surveyed for Christopher Stump A Certain Tract of Land, adjoining to his other Land on a Branch of Tulpehoccon, in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a marked black oak Tree at a corner of his other Land Thence extending by the same Land North East by East one hundred and thirty Perches to a post Thence by vacant Land North West by North one hundred thirty Perches and an half to another Post Thence by vacant Land South West by West one hundred and thirty Perches to another Post Thence by vacant Land South East by South one hundred thirty Perches and an half to the place of Beginning Containing One hundred Acres and the allowance of Six acres for Roads &c. Survey'd the 13th Day of Sept^r A^o Dⁱ 1735 & me W^m Parsons.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Twenty fourth day of August 1906.
