



By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Proprietor Bearing Date the first day of November Anno Dom. 1739 Surveyed to Jacob Snider a Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a white oak in the Line of John Brubakers Land thence South 30 West 40 per. to a white oak thence South 10 deg. East 47 per. to a post thence South 30 deg. West 60 per. to a white oak thence South West by South 70 per. to a white oak thence South 55 deg. East 94 per. to a Black Oak thence South 82 deg. East 200 per. to a white oak thence North 239 per. to a hickory thence West 100 per. to a Black oak thence North 70 deg. West 100 per. to a white oak thence South 30 deg. West 40 per. to a white oak thence South 10 deg. East 47 per. to the place of Beginning containing three Hundred & two Acres with the usual allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads &c. One Hundred Two acres whereof Being an Addition to the quantity in the said Warrant - Surveyed the 30th day of this Instant November.
