 bearing Date the Eighth Day of April Anno Domⁱ 1740 for 200^{ac}
 I have Surveyed and Laid out unto Solomon Shepherd on
 Conewaga Creek in the County of Lancaster on the west-
 side Susquehanna river Two hundred and Eighty acres of
 Land with allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent Beginning at a maple
 tree in Andrew Livingstons Line Thence South twenty six-
 Degrees Easterly Two hundred and twenty two $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a
 Post Thence South Sixty four Degrees Westerly one hundred
 and Sixty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a White Oak Thence North twenty six Degrees
 Westerly Two hundred and Sixty Eight $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Span-
 ish Oak Thence North Nineteen Degrees Easterly one hundred
 thirty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to the said Creek Thence Down the same—
 Traversing the several Courses thereof near about Two—
 hundred $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to the place of Beginning.
