



A Draught of a Tract of land called Dublin. Situate on a large Branch of Nescopeck, about four miles & a half Eastward of the Indian path leading from Nescopeck to Fort Allen & adjoining and between land Surveyed for Alexander Nesbitt & Jonathan Nesbitt, in the County of Northumberland, containing three hundred & one Acre- and three quarters of an Acre, besides the usual allowance of 6<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Cent for Roads &c<sup>to</sup> Surveyed the 11<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1773 for Walter Stewart, in Pursuance of a Warrant Dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1773.
