



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th day of June 1772, a survey was made on the 3^d day of July following for Cornelius Cox, on a Certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Sunbury, in the County of Northumberland, marked in a General Plan of said Town, Number Two hundred and Eighty Three. Containing in Length East and West Two hundred and Thirty feet, and in Breadth North and South on Broad Way fifty Seven feet, Six Inches.

Bounded Westward by Broad Way aforesaid, Southward by Lot Number Two hundred and Eighty four, Eastward by River Alley, and Northward by Lot Number Two hundred and Eighty Two. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 27th day of April 1775, for Stephen Sutton by Warrant dated the 26th day of April 1775.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this first day of November 1906.
