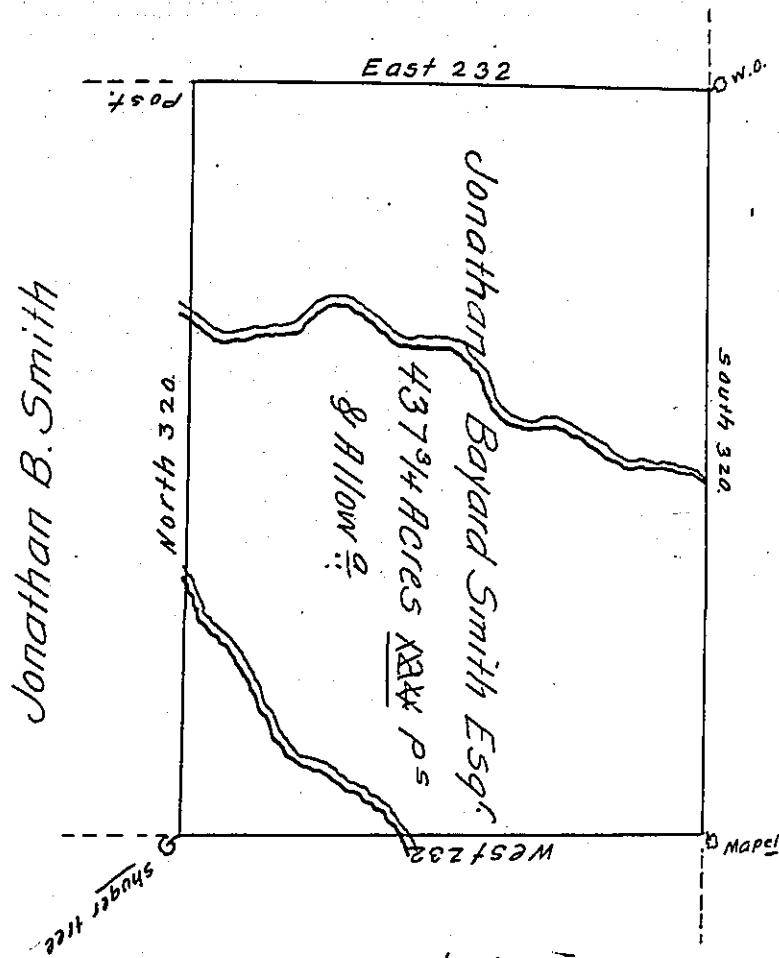

Surveyed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July A<sup>n</sup> D<sup>o</sup> 1785 in persuance of a Warrant N<sup>o</sup> 343 granted to Jonathan Bayard Smith Esq<sup>r</sup>. Dated at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of May A<sup>n</sup> D<sup>o</sup> 1785 for Four Hundred ~~and~~ acres.
