



In pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April A.D. 1794  
was surveyed for Harmon Ross. The 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1817. The above  
described tract of Land containing 415 acres 16 perches and allowance of  
Six per cent for Roads &c. and at the time of Making said survey, George  
Mason<sup>t</sup> was in possession of the same and there appeared to be upwards  
of 25 acres of the land cleared and fenced. a house fit for the habitation  
of man & a Crust Mill and other buildings - Situate in Venango Town-  
ship Crawford County Pennsylvania.
