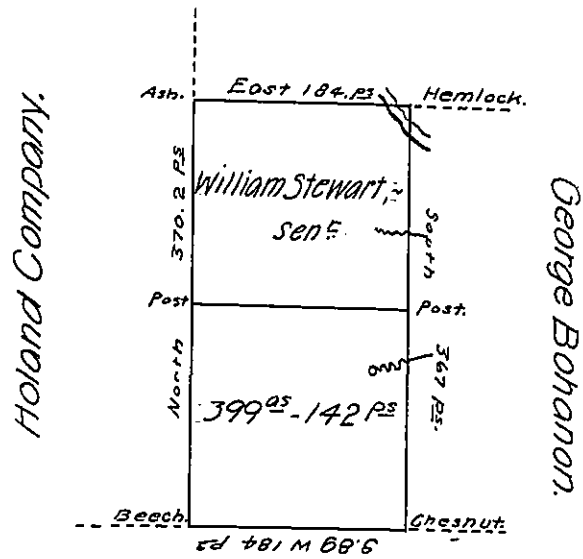

In Pursuance of a Warrant for 400 acres dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May, A.D. 1792; granted to William Stewart, senr., was surveyed on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1817. The above described tract of land containing 399 acres, 142 perches and allowance of six per Cent for roads, &c. situated in Bloomfield township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Isral Shrieve was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of 12 acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between said Shrieve and Joseph Clark.
