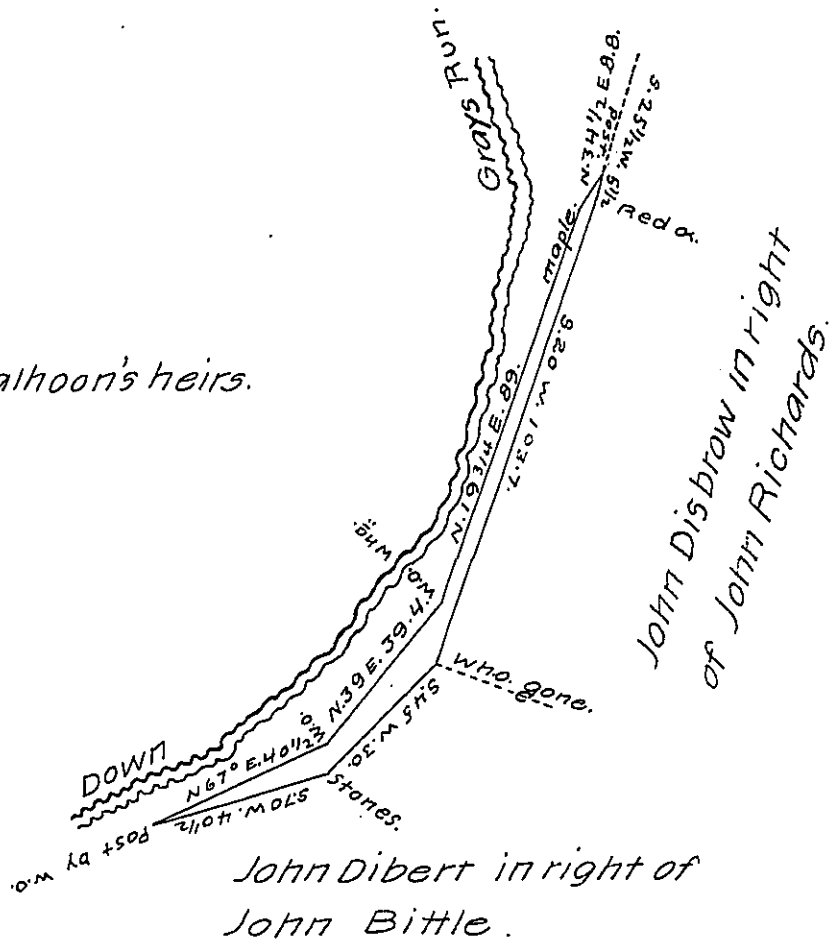


John Calhoon's heirs.
