In pursuance of a Warrent granted to John Scott dated the tenth day of May A. D. 1806. Surveyed a small Island situate in the River Susquehanna, in the Township of Martick and County of Lancaster Called Brushy Island about Thirty perches below Patten's Island and about forty perches above Sand Bare Island containing Two acres and Fifty perches of Land neat measure the 21st May 1806

N.B. the above Island being supposed to be disputed by Alexander Gorden.
