



Whereas in Pursuance of an Order of Survey N<sup>o</sup> 1223 there was Survey'd to John Eaton a tract of land now situate in Armstrong Township in the County of Westmoreland, and Whereas David Semple hath requested me to divide said tract of land in order that he might obtain a patent for part thereof, therefore on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of March 1803, I have survey'd the above described piece of Land, part of the tract aforesaid containing One hundred and Fifty eight acres and thirty three perches with an allowance proportioned to Six P. Cent situate in the Township and County aforesaid
