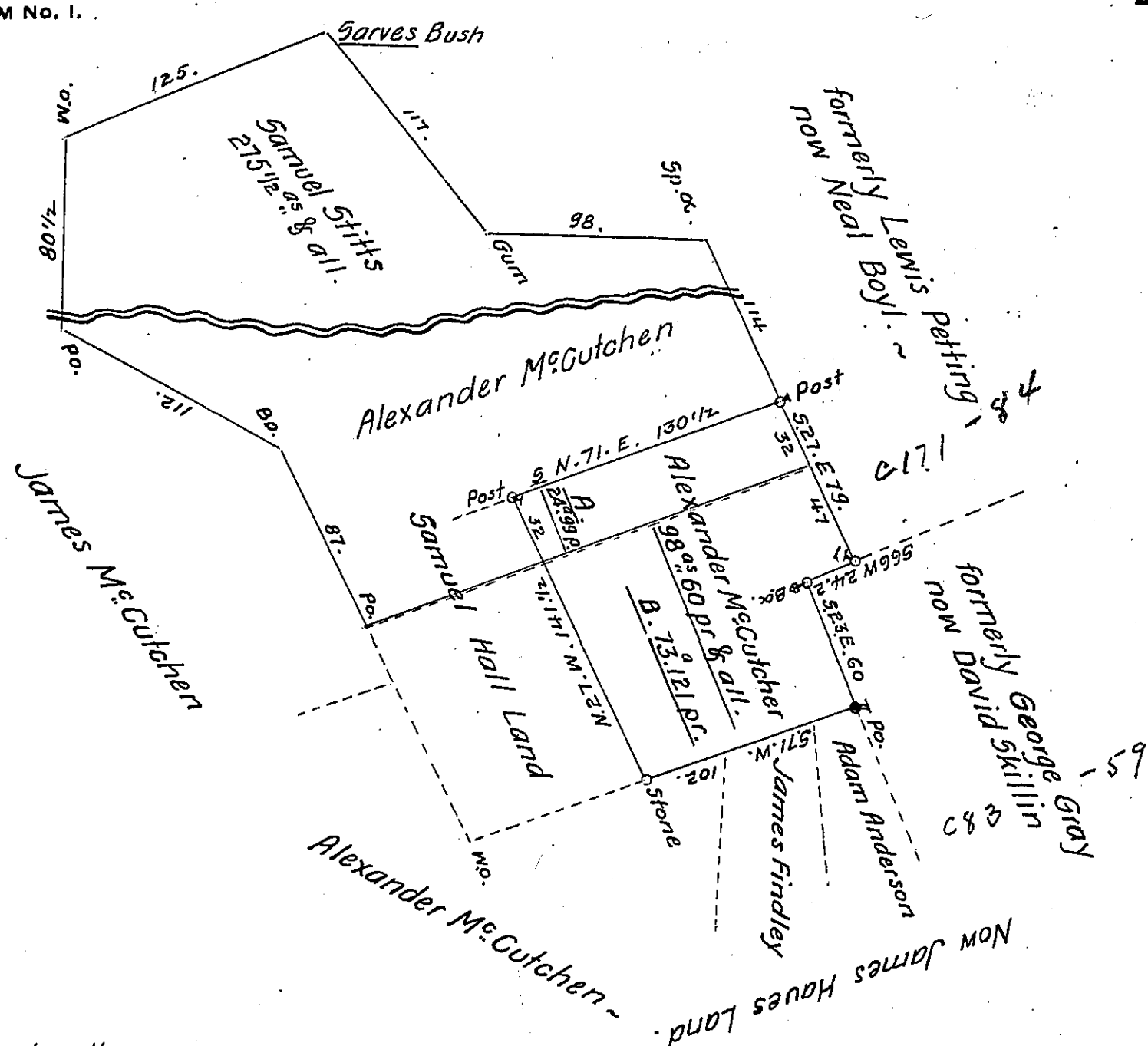

Surveyed the above described Ninety eight acres and Sixty Perches and the Usual Allowance, for Alexander McCutchen Jr. It being a part of two Contiguous Tracts of lands, The part marked letter A. Containing 24^{as} 99 pr. & all. being a part of a Tract of land Surveyed in Pursuance of A Warrant granted to Samuel Stitts dated the 22^d day of Oct. 1773. and Surveyed 10th Nov 1773. And the Other part thereof Marked letter B. Containing Seventy three acres & 121 pr. & all. Being a part of a Tract of Land, Surveyed March 4th 1809 in Pursuance of a Warrant. Granted to Dorothy Stitts & David English Executors of Samuel Stitts, dated the 2^d day of May 1796 both these Tracts are now situate in Washington Township, Westmoreland County.
