



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor dated the 10th day of March Anno Domini 1737 the above described tract of Land was surveyed to Conrod Sharp in Heidelberg Township in Lancaster County beginning at hickery in a line of Michael Bush thence North 25 Degrees East by vacant Land 38 perches to a Black Oak Thence North 13 Degrees East by the said land 66 per. to a White Oak by Tulpehoccum Creek Thence down the same on the several Courses thereof 113 Perches to a Post Thence North East Crossing the said Creek and By the land of George Reigel 36 perches to a Hickery Thence North 70 Degrees East by the land of Jacob Weigner 33 Perches to a Black Oak thence South East By Vacant land 100 Perches to a Post by Tulpehoccum Creek Thence up the same on the several Courses thereof 150 perches to a White-Walnut tree Thence South 75 Degrees East crossing 5^d Creek by Vacant Land 34 Perches to a White Oak. Thence South 25 Degrees West by Vacant Land 72 Perches to a Spanish Oak Thence North 65 Degrees West by Vacant land and the land of 3^d Michael Bush 102 perches to the place of beginning containing One Hundred and Sixty Nine acres beside the Usual allowance for Roads 28th 1^{mo}. 1738.
