

The above described tract of land was survey'd [under the direction of W. Cox Ellis, a former deputy Surveyor for this County] on the 15th of Aprile 1809, to Jacob Snyder in pursuance of his warrant granted the 28th of May 1793. Situate as above described on Whitedeer hole-creek in Washington Township, Lycoming County. Containing One hundred Acres, One hundred and fifty Eight perches and allowance of Six 3pt. Ct. And now at the request of said—Snyder examined and approved by me October 30th 1813.
