



The above is a draught of a Tract of Land called Gilboah upon the waters of Racon Creek. Washington County, Surveyed Octr. 29<sup>th</sup> 1785 for John McCarmack. In consequence of a Certificate from the Commissioners of Virginia in the following words viz

We the Commissioners for adjusting Claims obliterated -ed Lands in the Counties of Monong<sup>a</sup> & Yohogania & Ohio do hereby Certify that John McCarmack is entitled to Four hundred acres of Land in Yohogania County upon the waters of Racon - to include his actual Settlement made in the year 1775.

Given under our hands at Coxes Fort the 18<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>y</sup> 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
