



Situate in Hopewell Township York County, containing as above set forth five acres, thirty perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of October 1821 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Samuel Yont for 5<sup>acs</sup> dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of September 1821.

N.B. By a reference to the above Warrant, it will be seen that it calls for land "lying between Philip Heilman on the south, Christian Souder on the East, Justina Kunkel on North, and Jacob Kaufman on the West" And by a reference to the above plot it will likewise be seen, that said land does not adjoin either of the above named persons - it nevertheless lies between them, and one of the corners (to wit) a "Chestnut Oak" is a corner of Christian Souders land, above named - About one acre of the above land has been improved about ten years.
