



In pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1785, entitled, "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands," promised the troops by this Commonwealth, and by order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1786, the above described Tract of two hundred Acres of Land, and allowance for roads & No. 1839, situate in District No 2 on the west side of the Allegheny river, in the county of Westmoreland
