



In pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1785, entitled, "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands, promised the troops by this Commonwealth;" and by order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1786, the above described Tract of two hundred & fifty Acres of Land, and allowance for roads, &c No. 169, situate in District 1101, on the west side of the Alleghany river, in the county of Westmoreland.
