



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24th day of February 1785 "Entitled" an act for directing the mode of distributing the donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth And by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Supreme Executive Council. I have Surveyed on the 11th day of November 1785. The above discribed Tract of Two Hundred acres of land and allowance of Six p<sup>r</sup> Cent for Roads &c. N° CLXXXIX situate in district N° 1 on the West side of the Allegany in the County of Westmoreland.
