



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24th day of February, 1785, entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops by this Commonwealth;" and by order of the Surveyor-General, with the approbation of the Honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed, on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of June 1786 the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and allowance for roads & N° 1908, situate in District N° 2, on the west side of the Alleghany river, in the county of Westmoreland.
