



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24th day of February 1785, entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth;" and by order of Surveyor General with the approbation of the Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 19th day of November 1785 the above described Tract of two hundred acres of land and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. N.º 1620 situate in District N.º 8, on the west side of the Alleghany river, in the county of Westmoreland.
