



By virtue of an order in warrant ~~in warrant~~ for laying out or surveying a Tract of Land on the West side of Susquehanna for John Carsson opposite to ye Settlement late of Peter - Allen (to me Directed) That I Survey fifty acres of Land on that side the River for a Publick Ferry or Landing place adjoining ye said Tract, pursuant to the said Order I have Dated ye 26<sup>th</sup> Day of October Anno Dom: 1737 Surveyed on the 21 day of february Anno Dom: 1739 by Regular lines & bounds as followeth Beginning at a Burch Tree Thence South 38 Degrees west 50 P's to a Black oak thence South 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Degrees west 106 P's to a Chesnut Oak, thence South 48 west 74 P's to an other Chesnut oak thence South 80 East 125 P's to Susquehanna River thence up the said River by its several Courses 175 P's to the place of beginning Containing 55 acres and the allowance of six acres <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> Cent for Roads and highways.
