By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twentiyeth day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Henry Whitston a tract of Land situate in Maxetawny in the County of Philad^a - Beginning at a post a corner of Henry Harpman's land thence by land of Joest Sasmanhoust North Eighty degrees East One hundred & Thirty one perches and by Vacant land the same Course Eighty ^{nine} ~~one~~ perches to a post thence by Vacant land South Ten degrees East One hundred and fifty perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant land South Eighty degrees West Two hundred and Thirty seven perches to a post in a line of Andreas Fishers land thence by the same North Ten degrees West fifty eight perches to a hickery sapling thence by land of Henry Harpman North Eighty deg^s East Seventeen perches to a Hickery thence by sd Harpmans land North Ten degrees West Ninety ^{two} ~~three~~ perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six p Cent. Surveyed Decem^r 15. 1734 By Nich^o Scull
