

The following note attached to the Original

Memorandum-

By a Recurrence to the Caveat Book in the time of the late Proprietaries when Mr Tilghman was Secretary of the Land Office it will be found that Dan^l Slagel & Richard Peters had a Hearing on Caveat & the Determination was against D Slagle in a Dispute about this Land which is in the heart of an old Tract of Richard Peters's held by an older Right. Slagel had a Survey on the Warrant under which he claims this Land made on a Tract several Miles from this. The Survey was found among his Papers & brought to the Office 23^d March 1795 which see enclosed "York County Daniel Shliegle 116⁴⁵". Besides this either Daniel Shlagel in his Life time or his Representatives since his decease have taken out a new ~~Warrant~~ Right for the Land mentioned in the old Survey to save the purchase Monies & as I am informed - I claim this Land & desire it may not be patented
