



The above is a Draught of a Survey made November the 13<sup>th</sup> 1793 in pursuance of a Warrant Granted to the Trustees of Washington Academy for 3,000 Acres of Land in Separate Tracts, Dated the 9<sup>th</sup> of August 1793, Situate North Westward of the Rivers Ohio and Allegheny on the Waters of Connequenesing Creek in District N<sup>o</sup> 10. Called Black Oak Ridge (Adjoining a Tract of Land Survey'd for Said Trustees Called Whirl Pool.) Containing four Hundred Acres together with the Usual Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads.
