



A Draught of a tract of land Situate on the waters of the Tunthannoc Creek, in the Township of Lenox, in the County of Susquehanna, adjoining land of Webster Osterhout on the south and vacant land on the other three sides. Containing two hundred and fourteen acres and fifty four perches, and the usual allowance of six per cent for roads &c. The above tract has an improvement of twenty five or thirty acres said improvement was commenced in the year 1805 by Samuel Washburn, said improvement was sold several times and passed into the hands of the said Amos Taylor, on the 3rd June 1832, sd-Taylor leased said improvement to Jacob Felton for a term of two years, I have the lease, but said Felton never paid any rent, but still lives on the premises and occupies the improvement and has lived on it since 1832. - Felton did not come on the ground and forbid me to make the survey. I understood that the said Felton occupied and lived on the improvement previous to 1832.
