



The above is a lot of land surveyed to Stephen Ullery 4 mo. 20, 1818 in pursuance of a Warrant dated Dec. 29, 1817 lying in the Bethlehem township County of Washington Pa. Beginning at a W.O. on the N. bank of a Run & corner of George Custard's land, and John Horn's (formerly Miles Haidon's) land, thence with the latter N 4 E 60 perches to a Post by Ten Mile Creek, thence down the same by land of s^d Ullery N 61 E 31.2 to a post, thence across a narrow neck ^{by} Ullery's land S 35 E 11 to a post by said Creek, Thence partly down the same & partly up said Run from the mouth thereof by Vacant land S 15 1/2 W 18 to a Hickory, then by Vacant land S 14 E 14 to a W.O. a Corner of said Custard's land, thence with the same S 56 W 15 to a W.O., N 80 W 9 to an Iron Wood (gone) S 28 W 32 perches to the Beginning, Containing 8 Acres & 71 perches and 6 Pr. Ct. allowance. Let this Lot of land be called the "Mockasin"
