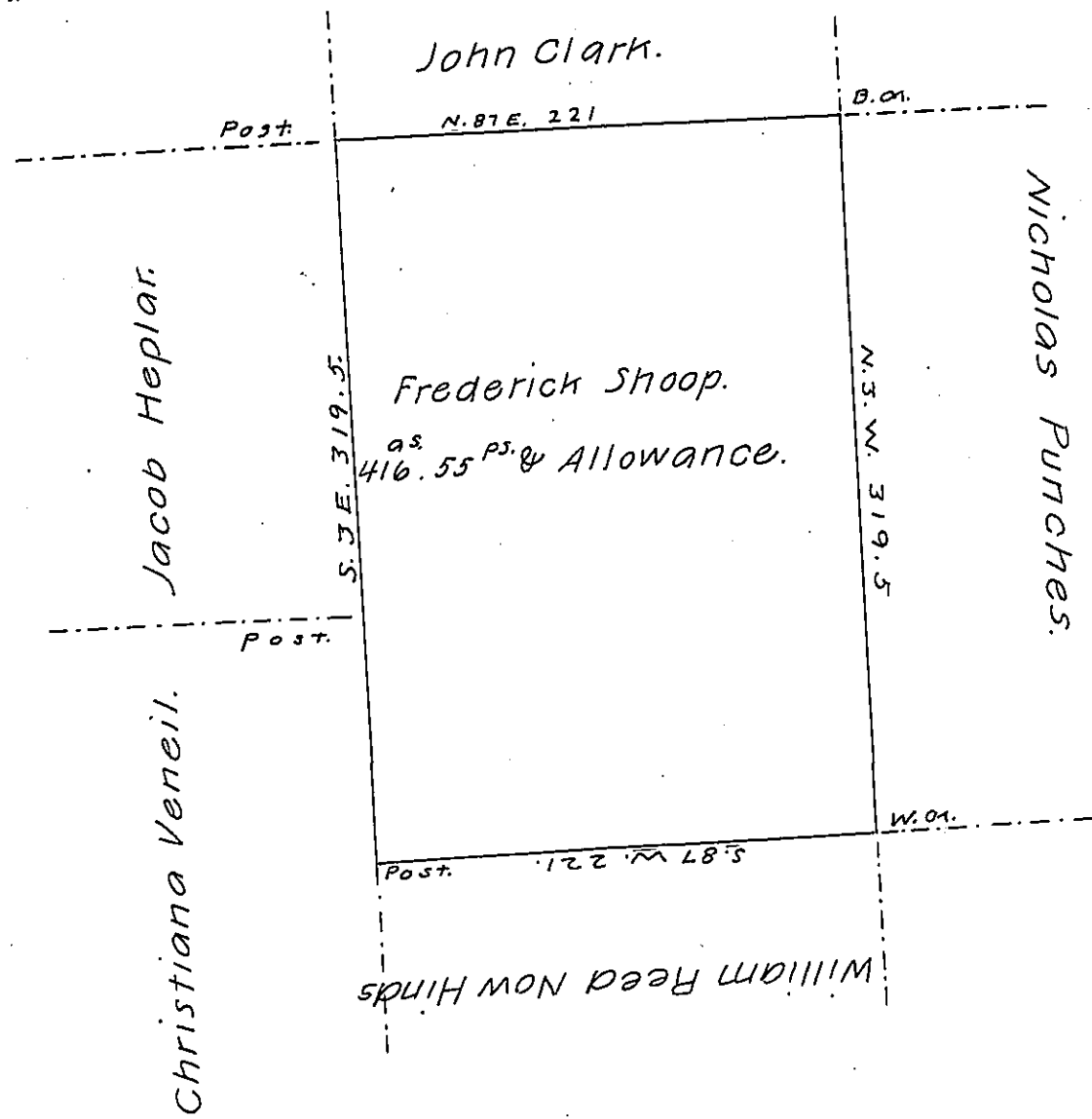

Surveyed to Frederick Shoop on the 12th day of May 1814 the above described tract of land Containing Four hundred and Sixteen Acres and fifty five perches with an allowance of Six pr. Cent &c. In pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Said Shoop dated 8th March 1814 Situate N.W. of the Allegheny river and adjoining lands Settled by— Hinds, Christiana Veneil, Jacob Heplar, John Clark and Nicholas Panches on the Waters of Sugar Creek— Sugar Creek Township Armstrong County. And I do Certify that there is a Family residing on the above described tract of land under and for the use of the said Warrantee Frederick Shoop and ^{has} upwards of forty Acres Cleared fenced and cultivated and has a dwelling house and double barn Erected thereon &c.
