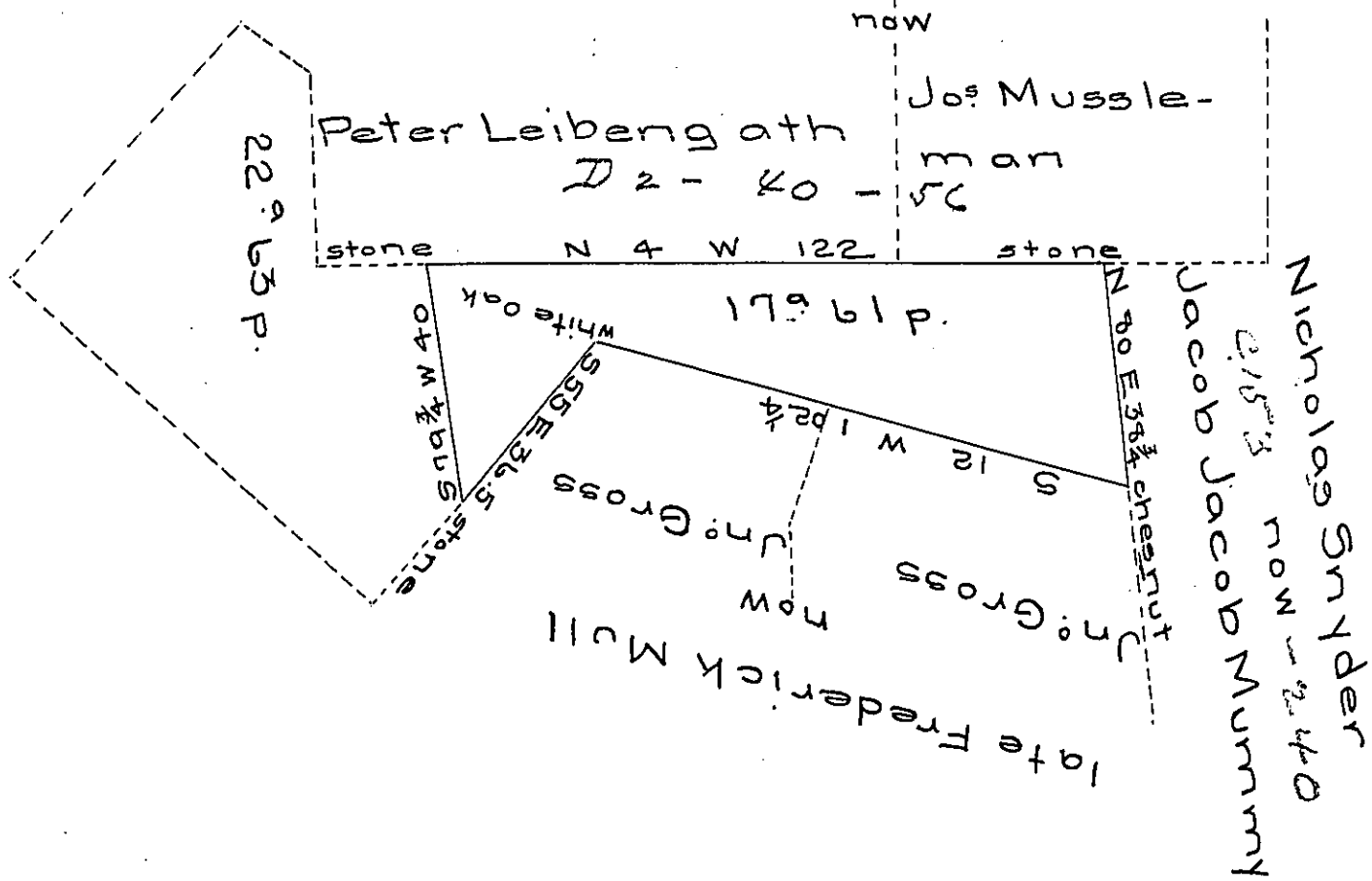

By virtue of a warrant dated 21 day of December 1785 granted to Nicholas Syder. Surveyed March 18<sup>th</sup> 1840 to Jacob Mummy the above described tract of land situate in Lehigh township Northampton County containing seventeen acres & 61 perches and the allowance of six per cent.

The above described tract of 17<sup>1/2</sup> & 61 ps. appears to have been a part of a tract of 39<sup>1/2</sup> & 124<sup>1/2</sup> ps. which David Cochran D.S. surveyed 15<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1785 to Jacob Snyder by virtue of his warrant dated 15<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1785. the part containing 22<sup>1/2</sup> & 63 ps. was returned 20 May 1789. whether Jacob Snyder abandoned the part containing 17<sup>1/2</sup> & 61 ps or how it came I can not say but it appears that it ~~was~~ has since been surveyed to Nicholas Snyder by virtue of his warrant dated 21<sup>st</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1785 and been occupied by Jacob Mummy since the year 1806.
