



A Draught of a tract of land called— situate adjoining land of Bull & Peck and the North West line of the Certified Township of Huntington, in the Township of Huntington Luzerne County containing one hundred and five acres and twenty perches and the allowance of six per cent for roads & including an improvement commenced the first day of March 1795. Consisting of (a dwelling house and Barn and ) twenty or more acres of improved land (on which a family actually reside and occupy the same) surveyed to Levi Seward the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1814. In pursuance of a warrant dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May A.D. 1814
