Containing in Length East & West Two Hundred and forty feet, and in Breadth North and South Sixty feet; Bounded on the South by Lowther Street, And on the West by Hannover Street; And on the North by a Lott N° 178; and on the East By a Lott N° 191; Marked in the Plan of Said Town N° 177.
