



Resurveyed on the <sup>10</sup>10th day of September 1867, the above described tract of land. In pursuance of a warrant granted to Richard Wells dated January 20, 1774 Containing three hundred and thirty seven Acres and one hundred and twenty two perches and an Allowance of Six per cent &c. Situate then in Westmoreland County, now Cowanshannock Township Armstrong County. A patent was granted on the 23rd day of July 1850, to Robert McIntosh and James Simpson Ex. in trust for the Devisees of Henry McBride, for two hundred and three Acres and fifty four perches and Allowance &c. (Enrolled in Patent Book H. Vol. 47. page 564) it being the west end of the above described Stract of land.

That part, William McIntosh for himself and Others being the east end of said tract of land, contains One hundred and thirty four Acres and sixty eight perches and Allowance of six per cent, situate in the township of Cowanshannock aforesaid. Unpatented.
