Thence by Rob<sup>t</sup> Young and Arthur Bell, N 14<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 92 p.<sup>s</sup> to a Dead Beech, Thence N. 62<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 24 p.<sup>s</sup> to a Down Beech, N. 12° W. 127 p.<sup>s</sup> to a Beech, thence N. 25<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 160 p.<sup>s</sup> to a Stone by the Susquehanna River, Thence Down the River N. 79° E. 93 p.<sup>s</sup> N 48<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>° E. 29 p.<sup>s</sup> to a post, Thence by Nelson Young, S. 47<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 189 p.<sup>s</sup> to the Beginning. Containing 285 acres, 149.4 p.<sup>s</sup> and allowance.
