Surveyed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May 1831 in pursuance of Matthias Ressler's Application N<sup>o</sup> 3758 for 250<sup>a</sup> dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May 1767 the whole now owned and occupied by Michel Wire and John Jacoby

Report. The part where the Letter A is placed containing 29<sup>a</sup> 158<sup>p</sup> & c<sup>o</sup> was surveyed and returned by George Stevenson late D.S. in pursuance of a warrant granted to Baltzer Kneritzer for 100<sup>a</sup> dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1750. The residue is held by the said Jacoby & Wire on said application.
