



In pursuance of a Warrant granted to Anthony Woodcock dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of July 1766. I did on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April 1770, Survey and lay out the above Described Lot of Ground for Thomas Scattergood, Situate at or near the North End of the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> without the Limits thereof on the West side of Front Street Continued, marked in a General Plan N° 101. Containing in Breadth North and South on Front Street Continued, 20 feet and in length East and West at the North side 107 feet and at the South side 106 feet. Bounded Eastward by Front Street Continued, Southward by Thomas Scattergood's other Lott N° 100. Westward by John Scattergood's Lott N° 103. and Northward by Widow Scattergood's Lott N° 102. N.B. Anthony Woodcock by Deed dated the 6<sup>th</sup> of April 1770. Conveyed the above Lott to Thomas Scattergood.
