Being part of a larger Tract of 262<sup>ac</sup> & 8<sup>ps</sup> and allow<sup>ce</sup> which was originally surveyed by George Stevenson late D.S. on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1757 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to George Whitman bearing date the 9<sup>th</sup> day of August AD<sup>o</sup> 1751. Resurveyed and divided off the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1817. and now at the instance of George Klinefelter Esquire the present owner the same has been calculated examined and found to be correct and at his request I make return of the Draught for confirmation April 12<sup>th</sup> 1821
